Josh introduced himself by telling the students that he really loves three things: 1) God, 2) his family, and 3) sharing and talking about Jesus. He asked the students if they have a favorite Bible verse, and students replied with Matthew 7:12 ("The Golden Rule"), Philippians 4:13 ("I can do all things through Christ"), and Ephesians 1:4 ("Even before He made the world, God loved us and chose us in Christ to be holy"). Josh went on to share about his favorite Bible verse (Jeremiah 29:11) and one of his favorite Bible stories (Jonah). He strategically tied in this month's theme of God's faithfulness into his favorite verse and story. As Josh explained Jeremiah 29:11 and the story of Jonah to the students, he encouraged them with the fact that even when we are not faithful, God remains faithful. Finally, he challenged students to be like Jonah: when we mess up, quickly run back to God and continue to do what He has called us to do.
