Students gave examples about scary situations like when mom and dad aren't home, or when a dog bit them, or simply death itself. Then students were able to recall what they had learned from last week and mentioned that we can pray to God when we are scared. This week, Justin gave the students another insight into what brings peace in troubling times: reading God's Word. He challenged the students to read the Bible by themselves or WITH THEIR PARENTS right before they go to bed. Mr. Stontz concluded the chapel with the words of Jesus and how He told His disciples that in this world they would have trouble but God gives us His peace through the Holy Spirit.
