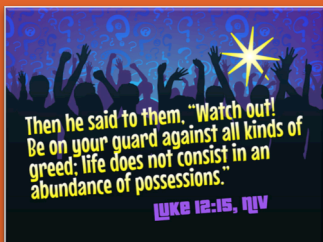
Tom Keefe
