#### LOVING LIKE CHRIST ON THE GOLF COURSE

egacy's own Boyd Huppert Land of 10,000 Stories tale began on the Girls State Tournament golf course in 2021. Emily Brandt, class of '24 and a freshman at the time, was experiencing uncanny failure on hole 14, scoring one over the par 5 hole's number – a 15. Each time she swung, the ball sailed into the water. Even Emily herself would admit that she had never played this poorly before, and at the State Tournament even.

However, with each swing, God was moving mightily. Because of her playing, Emily landed the earliest tee off of the State Tournament morning, which at the time seemed unfortunate, but as Emily played the round, a crowd began to gather, not around Emily, but around a man who was in tears watching Emily play.

Justin Holtan found himself at the State Tournament that his daughter would have qualified for if she had not tragically died in a collision with a semi truck just five months prior. His daughter Macy Jo had been sixteen at the time, and like Emily she was an excellent student and had participated in golf and performing arts. Not only were their interests similar, but to Justin they looked the same.

Emily had the same golf clubs, mannerisms, head cover, and glasses as Macy Jo. When Justin met Emily and the Brandt family, he explained the similarities and his captivation with her identical swing. When he had seen Emily during the practice round the day before, he thought, "That's my daughter." It took his breath away. The Brandts then gathered around Justin, hugging and crying, and then they prayed together.

Since then, the families have stayed in touch, and when Emily made it to the State Tournament in 2022, Justin was there to cheer her on again. It was such a blessing for him to follow her round and walk the final holes with

her. And when Emily was announced as the Individual State Champion, Justin couldn't have been more proud.

God moves in remarkable ways. Emily's dad, Jeremy, reflects, "After we met Justin back in 2021, it was so clear why Emily had scored a 15. God had a plan. Any other score, and she would have played in a different group that day, and Justin never would've gotten to watch her play." But instead, the Brandt family was able to minister and share the love of Christ on the golf course.

## LEGACY'S ROBOTICS TEAM LEVELS UP TO WORLDS

or many members of the LCA Robotics team, 8516 Wired Up, they had no idea what they were getting into when they competed at the 10,000 Lakes Regional at Williams Arena for their first-ever competition. At Regionals, 65 teams were split into randomly selected Alliances, made up of three school teams and their robots, for six rounds of qualifying matches, which included not only the technical components of robotics but demonstrating the business components of their project as well. At the end of the qualifying matches, teams competed in a playoff round where the top-ranked teams picked two other teams to join their Alliance.

Team Wired Up was chosen by the #1 seed in the last round of the draft for their robot's excellent climbing abilities. The newly-formed Alliance competed in the final round of the event and won the 10,000 Lakes Regional. With this

win, Legacy qualified for the FIRST Worlds Competition in Houston, Texas.

At Worlds, there were over 500 teams competing from around the world. Out of the 500 teams, only six first-year rookie teams competed in the event, one of which was Legacy. In a pool of 75 teams, Team Wired Up competed and finished the event ranked 35. Their high ranking in the pool earned them the Highest Seeded Rookie Team Award – an impressive feat for a small Christian school from Andover, Minnesota.

### NEW W.I.N. PROGRAM LIVES UP TO ITS ACRONYM

ast year, the elementary initiated W.I.N. Time, which stands for What I Need. The goal of this new program is to take literacy and mathematical concepts and use data to place students where their needs will best be met to remediate, support, or extend their learning.

W.I.N time occurs every Tuesday to Thursday throughout the day for each 1st-4th grade level, with an optional Friday W.I.N. time depending on what students need. During this time, all students from one grade level are intentionally dispersed between classroom teachers and academic specialists to address a specific concept. The time may be used to reteach with one specialist, to tackle a concept in a new way with a classroom teacher, or to link more than one concept together with another teacher. Students love this instruction time with different teachers, and many appreciate the additional movement

that comes with traveling to a new area of the building for their W.I.N. Time.

In order to provide an exceptional student W.I.N. Time, the elementary schedule was slightly restructured to generate a twenty-five minute meeting time for grade-level teachers at the start of the year. These teachers now have a common time in their schedule where they can gather, discuss teacher observations, assess student data that is tracked routinely, and plan what that W.I.N. time will look like for each student throughout the week. This time has also encouraged collegial questioning and collaboration among elementary teachers.

This program has truly focused the elementary on improving each student while also maximizing each teacher's skills and gifts. It's a win-win for everybody! "Though we are growing as a school, we are still small enough that we can specialize in helping each student and really focus on accomplishing the mission of our school daily by meeting the needs of every student. W.I.N. Time allows us to do just that."

# SECURITY IS TOP PRIORITY AT LEGACY

egacy Christian Academy partnered with Convergint to install the ASR Alert Systems to deploy a solution that supports the safety of our students and staff through a state-of-the-art emergency response technology.

ASR Alert Systems is a patented, cutting-edge critical incident response technology, specializing in the field of alert notifications to law enforcement and first responders. The system is designed to allow communication directly with law enforcement with the press of a button, reducing response times for better crisis management in the event of a violent incident.

Timing and accurate information are key elements in a critical incident. Law enforcement must be able to quickly obtain real-time information to interact with its school partners ensuring they successfully navigate a situation. With the ASR Alert Systems in place, Legacy Christian Academy,

The successful deployment of the ASR Threat Alert System solution gives students and staff the ability to summon help in an emergency with the simple push of a button. By integrating this technology with current response policies and procedures, Legacy is able to react immediately and effectively should a crisis strike.

In addition, the leadership team wanted the entire PreK program to be housed in one area rather than across the whole campus. Placing the entire program at the bottom of the main office stairs made the space accessible for everyone and near the previously constructed Playhouse room built by Mark Domino, so with a vision and dream, Lynda Domino applied for a few grants and sought donated labor. Mark Domino then set to the construction

plans for the new remodel, and after a summer of hard work, the space was opened for PreK students fall of 2021.

Each designed room was carefully imagined to feel inviting and fun for children, regardless of the room they were assigned to at the start of the year. And with such vibrant spaces it is hard to choose a favorite: Town, Ocean, Jungle, Playhouse – each room is unique and special for the students that learn in these beautiful spaces every single day.



At the heart of the app is a desire to continue to improve channels of communication with the families that attend Legacy. The app allows







### Launching the LEGACY FUND

t the outset of the 2021-2022 school year, the Advancement Department launched the Legacy Fund as a direct way to elevate, expand, and enhance current student experiences. Tuition covers 100% of operational expenses as well as all student field trips and camps like Deep Portage, Camp Shamineau, and even the future international senior missions trip. The Legacy Fund focuses on additional innovation, infrastructure, and scholarship investments for Legacy students.

In order to systematize asks, all fundraising now channels through the Advancement Department for the benefit of Legacy Christian Academy and is limited to only 2 asks in the year - the fall Legacy Fund ask and the spring Gala. With only two predictable asks during the year, the hope is that the

Legacy community feels honored and confident in their charitable giving and donors are able to see the direct ways their gifts have impacted the community.

*Under this new model, the Legacy* community generously gave to the Legacy Fund, far exceeding the goal of only \$450,000 and instead gave a grand total of \$765,774.65! What a blessing for our students.

At the heart of this reframing, Legacy's administration is committed to financial stewardship, developing a philanthropic culture, and sound fundraising practices while still cultivating student hearts of servanthood and leadership, encouraging the generosity of our donors, and providing an exceptional student experience at Legacy.
