

MS Family Evening Prayer Guide for the Legacy Day of Prayer

Prayer Prompts for Families (feel free to use one or more of these to help guide your prayer as a family)

- Acknowledge some of God's attributes by stating them and reading scripture that affirms them as prayer. Write them on index cards, the attribute on one side, and the scripture reference on the other. Take turns as a family reading each quality.
 - God is Love
 - Read: 1 John 4:8
 - God is Self-Sacrificing
 - Read: John 3:16, 2 Corinthians 5:21
 - God is Faithful
 - Read: Hebrews 13:5, Romans 8:39, Lamentations 3:22-23
 - God is Generous
 - Read: Luke 7:11
 - God is Holy
 - Read: Exodus 3:5-6, Psalm 8:9, Isaiah 6:1-5, Revelation 1:13-18
 - God is Omnipresent (everywhere)
 - Read: Psalm 139:7-12
 - God is Omniscient (all-knowing)
 - Read: Psalm 147:5
 - Pray for the students and their relationships and interactions at school
 - Between classmates
 - Between friends
 - With teachers
 - With staff
 - Meditate and pray 1 Corinthians 15:33, "Do not be deceived: "Bad company ruins good morals." Pray that your children surround themselves with good company and counsel! Also pray Psalm 111:10, "The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom; all those who practice it have a good understanding. His praise endures forever!"
