Dear Legacy Family,

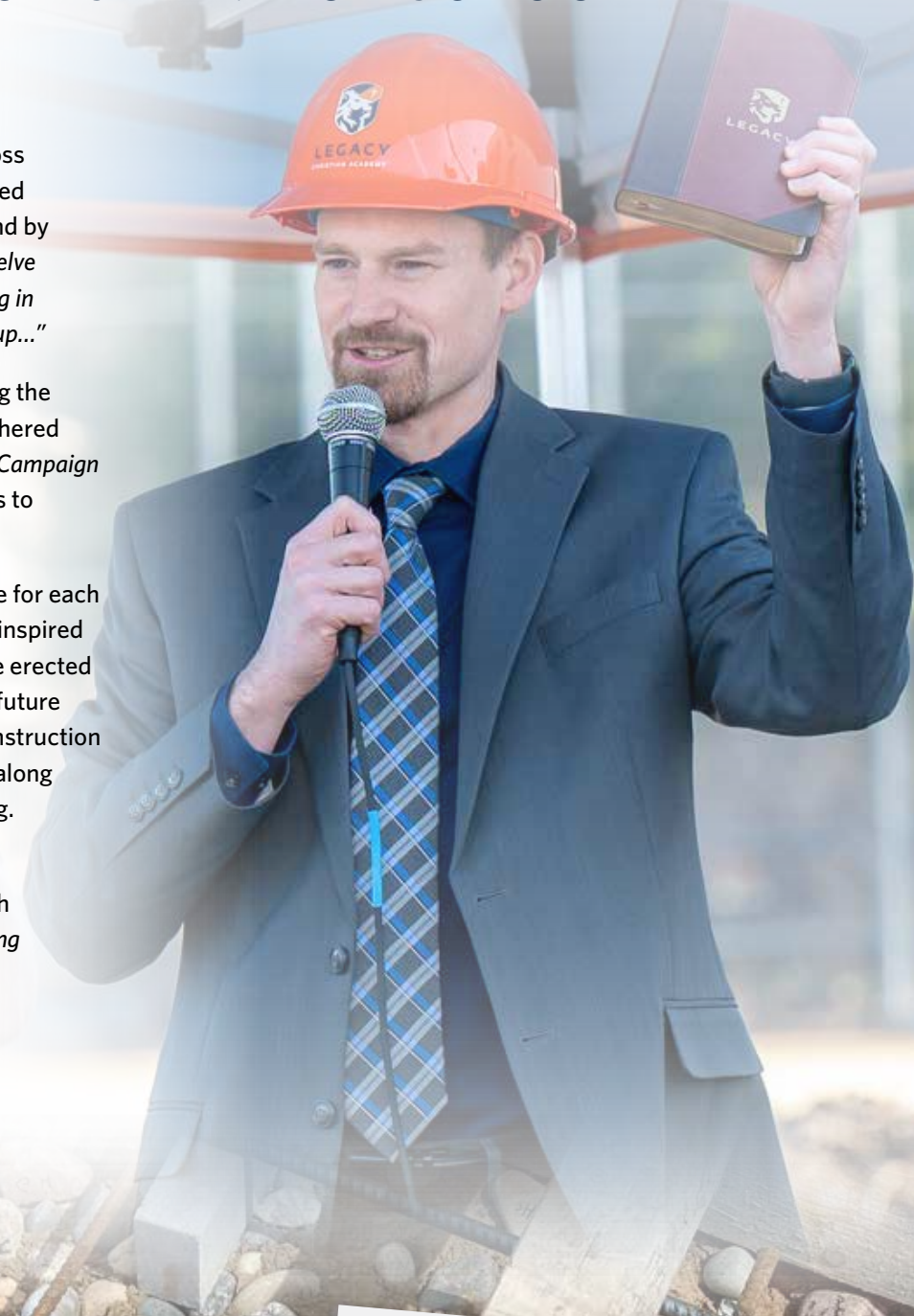
In the miraculous story of Joshua 3, the Israelites cross the Jordan River on dry ground and enter the Promised Land. Immediately, the Israelites are called to respond by memorializing the miracle. The LORD says, "Take twelve stones from the very place where the priests are standing in the middle of the Jordan. Carry them out and pile them up..."

The 2022-23 school year was a year of memorializing the goodness of our God. At the start of the year, we gathered together as a community for the *Ascending Together Campaign Kick Off*, and in just eight months, God moved hearts to give \$10,154,587. That is nothing short of a miracle.

And so just as the Israelites, we gathered stones, one for each student. Students prayed together and wrote words inspired by the Psalms of Ascent on the memorial stones. We erected a stone monument that stood on the grounds of the future academic building. Then we broke ground on the construction site in the spring of 2023, and eventually each rock, along with a Bible, was laid in the foundation of the building.

The 2022-23 school year was a remarkable year of God providing for Legacy Christian Academy through our 5-Year Strategic Plan, *Courageous Faith: Magnifying God's Sovereignty*. I hope this Annual Report serves as a marker for God's faithfulness and goodness as we continue to equip the minds of our students and disciple their hearts for the glory of our Lord.

MINISTRY LEADERS

A high school Leadership Affinity Group partnered with Settled, a Christian non-profit that approaches local homelessness with a unique solution. The group had the opportunity to visit formerly homeless neighbors at a Sacred Settlement in Maplewood, and to come alongside this organization with a unique need, the Legacy community donated a total of 1,814 pairs of socks during Homecoming.

MIDDLE SCHOOL CHAPEL LEADERS

Over 50 middle school students volunteered to lead chapel through worship, scripture reading, chapel tech, greeting, or being a student speaker. In addition all 8th grade students coordinated and led two chapel sessions as a part of their Spiritual Disciplines class.



MISSION TRIP LEADERS

Legacy juniors prepared for the 2023 Jarabacoa, Dominican Republic Senior Mission Trip, the first mission trip to ever be included within Legacy's tuition. Through Student International, the class of 2024 prepared for a unique site assignment from dentistry and microfinance to women's social work with the intent to minister the gospel to those in need and better understand God's heart for the nations.

During February's "I Love to Read" Month, 91 elementary students read their Bibles at least 25 of the 28 days in the month.

41% of our high school and 49% of our middle school, totalling 179 students, were intentionally disciplined by 23 staff mentors in weekly discipleship groups. Our high school juniors participating in a discipleship group also began training to lead their own middle school discipleship groups for the 2023-24 school year.

FINANCE PARK

Our 8th grade students experienced Junior Achievement: Finance Park for the first time. Each student was assigned a persona and a career with the goal of managing a realistic budget for all of their necessary finances.

OUR 1ST GRADE BOOK PUBLICATION

Miss Kubly's 1st grade class hosted a publishing party after the publication of their book, *God's Creatures*. Each page of this published book is illustrated and written by our 1st grade authors.



MAP MATH TESTING

With intentional vertical alignment, implementation of the intervention math curriculum, leveraged W.I.N. (What I Need) group times, and classroom math coaching from Ann Erickson, the K-8 Math Intervention Specialist, our elementary MAP Math scores showed significant improvement. 1st-4th Grade MAP Math scores were the highest they have been since the 2020 new norms, with 3rd grade almost doubling their growth in just one year.

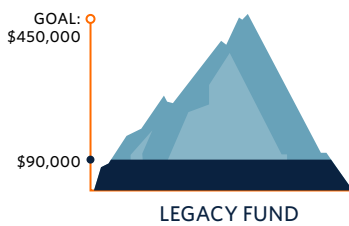
OUR LEGACY BUSINESSES

VOLUNTEERING & VISITING

During the 2022-23 school year, Legacy welcomed 209 parent volunteers into our classrooms, hallways, and events to support our students and staff. Better yet, over 4,000 visitors signed in at the front office during the year, most of which were parents!



GO GUARDIAN

Middle school teachers piloted a new tool aimed at enhancing collaboration with parents while students learn how to properly utilize digital technology for its intended purposes. Go Guardian enables teachers to deploy project-specific content onto student Chromebooks, mirror screens across all devices, monitor student progress, and track home access to content. The Go Guardian safeguards apply even when the device is off-campus, giving parents the reassurance that a student can only use the device for its intended, academic purpose.

Legacy embarked on its 5-year Strategic Plan, *Courageous Faith: Magnifying God's Sovereignty* in 2021. The Strategic Plan focuses on six initiatives. These initiatives are all strategic building blocks that support Legacy's purpose of equipping the mind and discipling the heart of each student to ultimately magnify God's sovereignty. Let each of these initiatives stand as a marker for God's provision in the past and his faithfulness as we look toward the year ahead.

CAMPAIGN UPDATE

THE MIRACULOUS SUCCESS OF THE ASCENDING TOGETHER CAMPAIGN

In the fall of 2022, the Legacy community gathered to hear the heart of the school and a vision to grow. Jake Mulvihill, the Head of School, and the Board presented the 2-year *Ascending Together* Campaign to raise \$10.5M for the Legacy Fund, the New Academic Building, and Planned (Estate) Giving. God guided generous hearts to give in abundance, allowing for a groundbreaking ceremony during the spring of 2023 for the New Academic Building, opening spring of 2024.

The New Academic Building, a 3-story 29,000 square foot building, will feature 12 state-of-the-art classrooms, including equipped science labs for middle school and an Engineering & Innovation Lab for high school as well.

In addition to the \$8.1M given to the New Academic Building, our community has also given \$679,587 to the annual Legacy Fund to elevate, expand, and enhance student experiences beyond what tuition alone can provide. Many families also felt called to support the Endowment fund through estate gifts, committing \$1.375M to support the long-term financial strength and sustainability of Legacy.

What an incredible year of witnessing God work in the hearts of the Legacy community. The walls are now up, the concrete has been poured, and the New Academic Building stands as a testament to the generosity of Legacy and our good God.

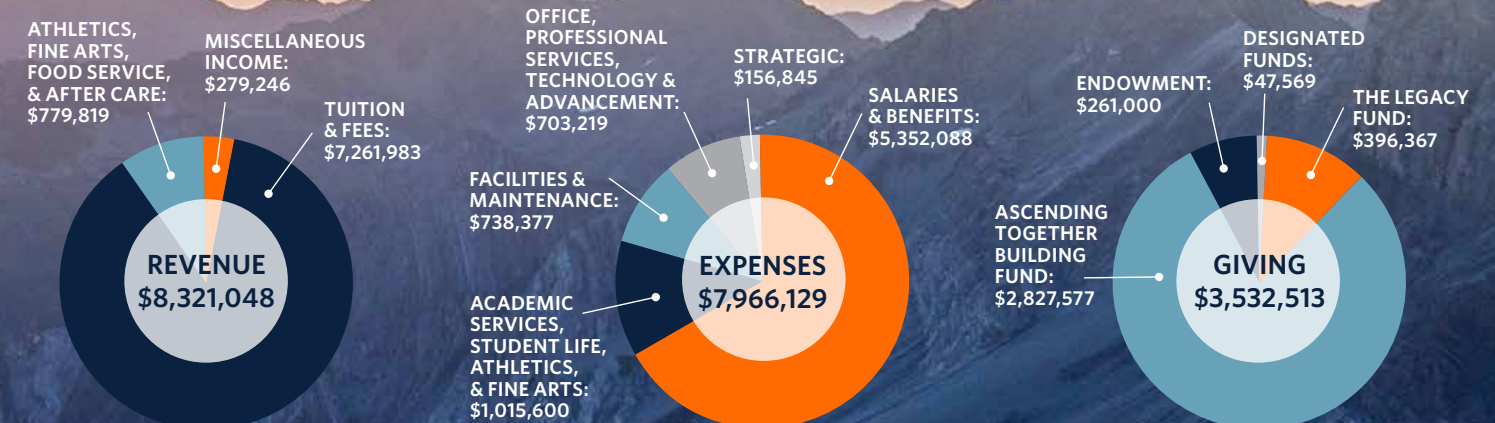

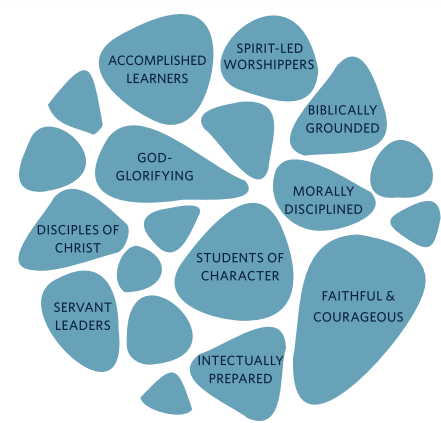
