

About Honors

The purpose of honors is to celebrate what evaluators identify as notable achievements of the

production they observed. Evaluators are asked to nominate individuals and elements that they believe are going above and beyond, and that they wish to celebrate. To justify their nominations, evaluators write at least one sentence stating why the nomination was given, what stood out or what was memorable.

Any element with student engagement or individual can be nominated for an honor, even if they were not listed to receive educational feedback. This is one reason the educational feedback packet is not intended to directly justify honors.

About Production Assessment

The Production Assessment is an educational tool intended to encourage, inspire and enhance Spotlight schools' theater programs and strengthen the skills of student artists — onstage and offstage.

Production Assessments are non-competitive.

Evaluators do not compare one high school production to another. Productions and individuals are not competing for a ranking or for limited spots for opportunities. Spotlight evaluators understand that students and programs are unique, and that they can't control the budget of a production, the resources available to them or the support received from their administrations and communities. Evaluators are trained to take in contextual and circumstantial information provided by the school in order to equitably evaluate each school production. Evaluators ask the key questions, "What are students doing with what they've been given and how can I help them grow?"

Spotlight Education understands and embraces that the experience of live theater is inherently subjective. While Spotlight evaluators are theater professionals who have been trained in our assessment process, they are 4-5 individuals with their own perspectives who encounter each production and program for only a few hours.

Examples include: building creative scenic elements, technical theater workshops, assisting the load-in or load-out of Spotlight Showcase at the State Theatre in downtown Minneapolis, etc.
